
Schleswig – Eckernförde – Jelling – Himmelbjerget

This is the fourth in the 4-year series of annual Golden Child Pilgrimages visiting the three crossing points of the four great landscape temples of Europe and the final point of revelation. This fourth Golden Child Pilgrimage will take place in the alta-major and brow chakras of the Swan landscape temple of Europe. When these two chakras are linked, revelation takes place.

The four landscape temples are associated with the myths of Europa and the Bull, Leda and the Swan, and the Rose and Cross. All three myths are associated with the Dionysian myth and relate to the planetary purpose of Europe as the throat chakra of the world.

The myths recount the birth of a 'Golden Child' called variously Dionysus, Bacchus, Hermes Trismegistus or Mercury ('True Word'). They are allegorical descriptions of a great mystery in which the landscape of Europe is the stage on which we play our parts in this mystery, knowingly or unknowingly. They reveal the spiritual purpose of Europe, which is to speak words of wisdom and truth that can inspire and help create a planetary golden age.

Symbolically, the 'Golden Child' is born as a bull, attacked and torn to pieces by the Titans, then resurrected and raised as a swan. This fourth 'Golden Child' pilgrimage will be celebrating the 'Golden Child' as the swan, in the head area of the Swan of Europe. The swan symbolises the illumined state of being, in which revelation takes place. This is when truth shines through the face as the "Countenance of God", bringing peace. The swan is the emblem of the great poet, who speaks the Truth, the Word of God, the Word of Love.



The four great landscape temples of Europe

During this pilgrimage, we will be mainly staying at the Hotel Strandhalle, Schleswig, where we will visit the nearby Schloss Gottorf, the geomantic centre of the Swan's alta-major chakra, and where, on Monday 7th Sept., we will be privileged to enjoy a private visit to the palace's special 16th century chapel, the Baroque garden and Giant Gottorf Globe. The next day we will visit Eckernförde, the eastern 'entrance' to the Swan's alta-major chakra, which was chosen by the Comte de St Germain as the place to spend the last four years of his life. On Wednesday 9th we will travel north to the brow chakra area of the Swan, visiting the Viking royal capital, Jelling, on the way to the remarkable landscape zodiac centred on the Himmelbjerget ('Heaven Mountain') that marks the heart of the Swan's brow chakra. After staying overnight at the Skandic Silkeborg, we will voyage by boat on the Silkeborg and Julsø Lakes to the Himmelbjerget, pilgrimage up to the summit of the 'Heaven Mountain', then return by coach to the Hotel Strandhalle, Schleswig, where, on the last full day of the pilgrimage, Friday 12th Sept., we will visit Schloss Gottorf again, to 'tie the knot'.

This 7-day pilgrimage will include teaching and guidance by Peter and Sarah, group meetings, prayers, meditations, dancing, singing, talks by official guides, entrance fees, coach journeys, boat trip, hotel accommodation, private meeting rooms, and all meals (breakfast, lunch and dinner). It will constitute an initiatic journey in which we shall, in effect, be performing a mystery on this particular stage of the world. Mysteries are like prayers: potentiated thoughts and actions that can inspire and help bring about better things, seeding places and the mind of the planet via its network of consciousness.
